

EARLI Oeuvre Award

An EARLI Oeuvre Award is given at each biannual EARLI conference to a living recipient in recognition of a broad range of achievements in the field of learning and instruction including excellence in scholarship and research as well as contributions to EARLI.

Eligibility

Members nominating a particular candidate should ensure that the candidate fits the following criteria:

- Active EARLI Membership of EARLI
- Member of EARLI for at least 10 years
- Can't be an actual EARLI Executive Committee member
- Actively participated at EARLI conferences
- An outstanding academic career with a substantial contribution to educational research

Nomination process

1. Nominations of candidates are made by each Award Oeuvre Committee member, that nominates minimum 4, maximum 7 candidates for the Oeuvre Award.

2. The nomination should include the following materials:

- An Electronic Form of Nomination briefly describing:
 - ✓ Personal information about the candidate (name, position, nationality)
 - ✓ The reasons for the nomination
 - ✓ Academic merits of the nominee
 - Contribution to educational empirical or theoretical research
 - The candidate's contribution to EARLI
 - The candidate major career landmarks
 - A list of his (her) the major publications

3. Selection Criteria:

- a)** International/European visibility and reputation
- b)** The important research findings (innovative and creative research)
- c)** The extent to which the findings have generated research;
- d)** The significant influence of the candidate's research;
- e)** High impact of the publications by the candidate
- f)** Grants and prizes received by the candidate.

4. Award Committee

A award Committee will examine the nominations received.

(7 persons appointed by the EC of EARLI)

Chair: Incoming President

2 members of the previous committee

2 previous award winners

2 new EARLI members (elected by the EC members and contacted by the chair

5. Selection of the candidates

Each committee member scored each candidate on a five point scale: 0 means don't know her/him or would not support her/him at all, 1 is little support, 2 modest, 3 medium, 4 strong and 5 very strong support. Summing up the scores the committee's actual view is revealed. Seeing the results, members may have re-considered their suggestions. These ratings may be repeated several times to see how the views are converging, and candidates who receive the least support may be dropped.

The form of the final decision can be a simple vote. This step should only take place when there is a high consensus within the committee about the winner of the award, and therefore consistent results can be expected.

6. Informing the Nominated Member

The AC Chair, in the name of the EC, will inform the candidate that he or she has been nominated for EARLI Oeuvre Award and will invite him/her to attend the conference

The winner receive a plaque of the award
