



EARLI 2023 - OEUVRE AWARD

The Oeuvre Award is offered at each Biennial EARLI Conference to a well-renowned senior scholar, in recognition of their outstanding achievements and excellence in scholarship and research in the field of learning and instruction.

1. Eligibility criteria

The nominee should meet the following eligibility criteria:

- The nominee is an active and senior member of EARLI.
- The nominee is not serving as a member of the EARLI Executive Committee at the time of the nomination.
- The nominee has an outstanding academic career with a substantial contribution to educational research.

2. Deadline for nomination

Nominations must be received by the **15th of May 2023** (Midnight CEST) by sending a completed nomination form to info@earli.org

3. Nomination

We kindly invite all EARLI members to nominate a suitable candidate for the award.

Please, note:

- Nominations require the support of **two EARLI members**. Self-nominations are not accepted.
- The nomination should contain an explicit statement that the nominee has accepted the nomination prior to its submission to the EARLI Office.





4. Oeuvre Award Committee and evaluation of nominations

An appointed Oeuvre Award Committee will review the nominations. The Committee will consist of five persons appointed by the Executive Committee of EARLI:

- Chair: President-Elect
- Two senior EARLI Members
- One previous winner of the Oeuvre Award
- EARLI EC Awards Portfolio holder

All committee members will be asked to declare any conflict of interest relative to the nominees, including but not limited to co-authorship, PhD supervision, shared funding, employment at the same university (past and present).

The following criteria will form the basis for the evaluation of the nominations:

1. Nominee's major contribution(s) to the empirical or theoretical advancement of the field of learning and instruction;
2. High societal impact of research work conducted by the nominee at the time of the nomination;
3. International visibility and reputation

Each committee member will score each nomination on a four-point scale, applied to the selection criteria:

- 1 = modest level of evidence
- 2 = good level of evidence
- 3 = high level of evidence
- 4 = outstanding level of evidence

The nomination accumulating the highest score will provide the basis for a decision to grant the Oeuvre Award. The final decision will be discussed and approved by all Committee members in an online meeting. If two or more nominees have obtained the same score, the final decision will be taken through a majority vote.
