



EARLI 2025 - OEUVRE AWARD

The Oeuvre Award is presented at each biennial EARLI Conference to a distinguished senior scholar, in recognition of their exceptional contributions and excellence in scholarship and research in the field of Learning and Instruction.

1. Eligibility criteria

The nominee should meet the following eligibility criteria:

- The nominee is an active and senior member of EARLI.
- The nominee is not serving as a member of the EARLI Board of Directors at the time of the nomination.
- The nominee has an exceptional academic career with significant contributions to educational research.

2. Deadline for nomination

Nominations must be received by the **30th of April 2025** (Midnight CEST) by sending a completed nomination form to info@earli.org

3. Nomination

We kindly invite all EARLI members to nominate a suitable candidate for the award.

Please note:

- Nominations require the support of **two EARLI members**. Self-nominations are not accepted.
- The nomination should contain an explicit statement that the nominee has accepted the nomination prior to its submission to the EARLI Office.
- **Please be mindful that the EARLI Board of Directors encourages a focus on ensuring that female and non-binary researchers are well represented in the nominations for the Oeuvre Award.**



4. Oeuvre Award Committee and evaluation of nominations

An appointed Oeuvre Award Committee will review the nominations. The Committee will be composed of five members, appointed by the EARLI Board of Directors:

- Chair: President-Elect
- Two senior EARLI Members
- One previous Oeuvre Award Winner
- Awards Portfolio holder of the EARLI Board of Directors

All committee members must declare any potential conflicts of interest related to the nominees, including co-authorship, PhD supervision, shared funding, or past and present employment at the same institution.

The following criteria will guide the evaluation of nominations:

1. The nominee's significant contributions to the empirical or theoretical advancement of the field of Learning and Instruction.
2. The societal impact of the nominee's research work at the time of nomination.
3. The nominee's international visibility and reputation.

Each committee member will evaluate the nomination on a four-point scale for each criterion:

- 1 = modest level of evidence
- 2 = good level of evidence
- 3 = high level of evidence
- 4 = outstanding level of evidence

The nomination with the highest score will be considered for the Oeuvre Award. The final decision will be made after discussion and approval by all committee members in an online meeting. In the case of a tie, where two or more nominees receive the same score, the final decision will be determined by majority vote.

5. Oeuvre Award Winner

All nominees will be invited to the EARLI 2025 Award Ceremony at the EARLI 2025 Conference, where the winner will be announced. Their winning name will be announced independently, without reference to other nominees or their respective ranking. The award recipient will also receive a commemorative award and a certificate.
