The Moral Matters of Teaching: A Finnish Perspective

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In this talk I will discuss teaching as a moral profession and provide both theoretical frameworks and empirical research findings to illustrate the moral nature of teachers' work. I use my own country Finland as an example of a country with high students' achievement in PISA studies and good teacher education.

Dr. Kirsi Tirri is a Professor of Education at the Faculty of Educational Sciences at the University of Helsinki, and a visiting Professor at St. John's University, New York, USA. Tirri was a Professor of Religious Education at the Faculty of Theology at the University of Helsinki in 2002-2010. Professor Tirri was President of ECHA (European Council for High Ability) in 2008-2012, and President of the Finnish Academy of Science and Letters in 2016-2017. Her research interests include school pedagogy, moral and religious education, gifted education, teacher education, and cross-cultural studies. She has published 14 monographs and numerous journal articles related to these fields.
