His research is focused primarily in STEM education and centered on interest development, failure, problem solving and teacher training. He is especially interested in how to get more young people engaged in solving authentic problems and considering STEM as a part of their future plans. He conducts research in formal and informal learning contexts and often looks to incorporate new technologies into his teaching and research. Dr. Maltese currently works with international colleagues in more than 15 countries toward improving the educational experiences of youth in order to better prepare them for an unpredictable future.
