

JURE 2026 – TRAVEL GRANTS

The EARLI Board of Directors is committed to recognise high-quality research conducted in countries that are facing financial struggles and where researchers have little access to funds. As such, we are pleased to offer a travel grant for participants in JURE 2026 with an accepted presentation. Participants who are awarded a travel grant will receive a one-off bursary towards their travel and accommodation costs (€ 1.000) and a fully waived conference fee for JURE 2026.

The main criterion to qualify for the award is that the applicant must reside and work in a low- GDP country¹. To determine the status of a low-GDP country in 2026, EARLI uses the World Bank Data for 2024.

The complete list of low-GDP qualifying countries for 2026 is provided below in alphabetical order:

A - Afghanistan, Albania, Algeria, American Samoa, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Arab Republic of Egypt, Argentina, Armenia, Azerbaijan.

B - Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belarus, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Burundi.

C - Cabo Verde, Cambodia, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Chile, China, Colombia, Comoros, Costa Rica, Cote d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cuba, Curaçao.

D - Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, Dominica, Dominican Republic.

E - Ecuador, El Salvador, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Eswatini, Ethiopia.

F - Federal Republic of Somalia, Fiji, French Polynesia.

G - Gabon, Gambia, Georgia, Ghana, Greece, Grenada, Guatemala, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Guyana.

¹ To qualify for these fees, you must reside and work in a low-GDP country (as per your institute and country of employment in your EARLI account).

² A low-GDP country is determined as a country which has an annual GDP per capita lower than 71% of the GDP of the total European Union (lower than 30.746,55 USD).

HOW TO APPLY

Below, you can find the application criteria, in order of importance. Please be advised that applications that do not meet the requirements outlined below will not be considered for the award.

The applicant:

- currently works in one of the countries outlined in the list above.
- is a member of EARLI. Preference is given to new EARLI members or first-time conference attendees.
- has an accepted proposal for JURE 2026. Preference is given to proposals with a high review score.

Applications for the JURE 2026 travel grant are welcomed until the 26th of April 2026 (midnight CEST) and should consist of a filled-out application form ([JURE 2026 – GRANT](#)) supported by a statement of what the applicant hopes to take away from attending the conference (max. 250 words).

Awardees are expected to write a 2-3 page report about their key takeaways from participating and presenting their work in the JURE 2026 conference. We also ask that partial support from EARLI be acknowledged in any publications or conference presentations that relate to the travel award.
