2. Joint SIG 20 & SIG 26 meeting: Guided tour

On Thursday, October 11th, you are welcome to join us on an exciting guided tour to the very unique city of Jerusalem, holiest to all three monotheistic religions, built on four thousand years old stones and stories, beloved home to people from many different cultures. During the guided tour you will have the opportunity to enjoy of the city's treasures (the Western wall, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, and many more), as we will re-trace the footsteps of kings, merchants and prophets, through narrow streets and markets.

The guided tour will also include a Kanafeh (delicious pastry) and coffee, which is a must in the old city and will end in Jerusalem's bustling, lively and colorful Machne Yehuda market.

5. SIG20 Invited symposium at the EARLI 2019 conference

The Rheinisch-Westfälische Technische Hochschule (RWTH) Aachen has undertaken the organisation of the 18th Biennial Conference of the European Association for Research on Learning and Instruction (August 12th – August 16th, 2019). The theme of this conference is *“Thinking Tomorrow’s Education: Learning from the past, in the present, and for the future”*. The conference has an established tradition of hosting rigorous research presentations in a range of topics within the broad theme of teaching and learning.
