



Workshop sessions allow presenters to display, explain and familiarise participants with a potentially useful teaching or research tool or method. The presentation may include references to completed research, but the point of the session is to demonstrate a method, tool or approach, not to present the research for criticism. The audience may offer their viewpoints and share their experiences with similar tools or practices for the same purpose.

Workshop sessions are scheduled for 90 minutes.

Requirements for preparing a workshop session:

- A title of up to 100 characters (including spaces).
- An abstract of 100 - 250 words.

An extended summary of 600 - 1000 words, detailing the aims, methodology, evidence and theoretical and educational significance of the method, tool or research practice.

Moreover, the summary should include the activities planned in order to ensure interaction with the participants during the workshop.
