



What you should consider when preparing your submission

Reviewers will consider the following focus points in proposals for individual contributions like **papers, posters, symposia**:

- Relevance to the domain of SIG10 / SIG21 / SIG25 or the synergy between the three SIGs
- The overall quality and (scientific) originality of the contribution
- Relevance of content for theory, practice and/or policy
- Theoretical framework(s) purposefully chosen
- Research methods and design well-supported
- (Preliminary) results, discussion and conclusions are clearly outlined
- The potential of the contribution to elicit critical reflection and lively academic dialogue
- Walking the talk: The form of the contribution includes elements that align with its content and/or the contribution demonstrates reflexivity
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Reviewers will consider the following focus points in proposals for **data sessions, roundtable discussions, workshops and research design forums**:

- The purpose and relevance of the contribution to this conference is clearly outlined
- The topic area, as well as core message/problem/idea are made explicit
- (Potential) research methods are clearly described and well-supported
- Planned / potential outcomes are described
- The session format promotes critical reflection and lively academic dialogue
- Walking the talk: The session format aligns with and supports the participants' engagement with the session content, and/or the contribution demonstrates reflexivity
