



How to submit a roundtable discussion?

Proposals for a roundtable discussion follow a two-part structure.

1. A **short abstract** with max. 250 words and
2. an **extended summary of 600 - 1000 words** (with references), which should include:
 - 1) the topic, questions and objective(s) of the discussion,
 - 2) the relevance of the topic, potential outcomes and possible contributions envisioned for the session,
 - 3) a brief introduction of the discussants, including their positioning and stakes in relation to the topic,
 - 4) how an inclusive space for discussion will be maintained, wherein every voice can be heard,
 - 5) proposed duration of the session; timeslots of 60 or 90 minutes will be offered (note that the conference organisers will confirm duration upon finalising the program, and reviewers might request revisions to the timeline based on the feasibility and quality of the proposed activities).
 - 6) an indication of how the introduction and moderation of the discussion are designed to “walk the talk”, i.e., How does the way the discussion is framed reflect the core issues you wish to address? How will the discussants’ experience of the session allow them to better engage with its content?
